



Art 1 Participation

The event is reserved for active members of Rotary International or Rotaract and members of the "Cycling to Serve" Fellowship. They can not hold a UCI license of "professional" type

Art 2 Equipment

Participants must have a racing bicycle that conforms to the practices of the competition. They wear a regulation cyclist outfit, wearing a certified helmet is mandatory. Failure to comply with these obligations may result in a departure ban during the event by the Race Direction.

Art 3 Financial contribution

Each participant will have to pay a contribution, to the commitment of 55 € uros, this contribution is to be paid during the registration

Art 4 Distinction of categories

The distinction of categories by age class is established according to age on the day of the event:

- CAT 1 over 65 (born before 08/09/1954)
- CAT 2 55 years old - 65 years old (born between 08/09/1954 and 08/09/1963 inclusive)
- CAT 3 45 years old - 55 years old (born between 08/09/1973 and 08/09/1963 excluded)
- CAT 4 under 45 (born after 08/09/1973)
- CAT 5 Women (test with CAT 1)

Depending on the number of participants, the Race Management reserves the right to marry two events between them, each category retaining its own classification.

Art 5 Nature of the competition

The competition is a race in individual circuit, any agreement between competitors is proscribed.

Art 6 Rules of the competition

The competition is under the authority of the Race Director appointed by the Rotary Club du Creusot, he decides in a sovereign way to ensure the safety of runners and fairness sports. Each competitor agrees to respect the instructions given before and during the competitions.

A lap of Circuit may be made by decision of the Race Director for puncture and mechanical incident on the podium.

Any doubled runner may be required to leave the competition circuit if the Clerk of the Course deems it necessary for the proper conduct of the event.

This private organization does not fall under any federal regulation, the event insurance contracted by the organizing club is exclusively subject to the regulatory provision relating to civil liability. Each competitor has his own personal cover covering the risks inherent to his participation.

Each competitor will have the obligation if necessary to submit to any medical or technical control carried out by the competent authorities.

Art 7 Commitment control and departure control

The registered competitors will have to present themselves at the race meeting on Friday 7 September 2018 between 14.00 and 18.00 to confirm their presence and to remove the bibs and microchips. These will be returned from the finish line at the end of each event to the volunteers in charge of this mission.

Bib numbers will be awarded upon validation of entries.

They must present themselves to the control of the departures at the latest 45 minutes before the departure of their event, with their identity card and their Rotary member card...

Art 8 Prizes - Shirts - trophies – Ceremonies

The distinctive jerseys and wreaths to the winners will be returned to the podium after the arrival of each event, the first three will have to appear on the podium at the call of the official announcer. Any absence from the protocol will result in the downgrading of the competitor.

According to the "Cycling to serve" provisions, 80% of the registration fee will be allocated as an endowment for the different rankings in each category based on the number of participants.

The price grid by category will be distributed as follows:

- 30% on the 1st, 25% on the 2nd, 20% on the 3rd, 15% on the 4th, 10% on the 5th.

The prizes will be awarded to the winners concerned during the official ceremony at the opening of the gala evening.

The presence of the competitors concerned is mandatory, any absence will result in the decommissioning of the person concerned.
